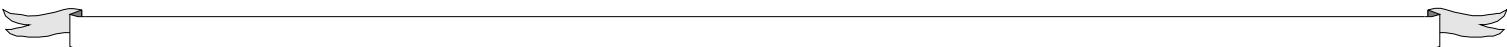
◆ Reunion 2008 Recap ◆


The Clingman-Jones 2008 Reunion was another fine celebration, highlighted by the Valley looking especially nice, good weather, a new fun event that was held, a camp-in surge, cabin construction nearing completion, and renovation plans being made, as well as plenty



of visiting and music making – all made possible by our ancestors' vision and commitment and today's family volunteers and donations.

- Cathy and Gary Kornegay's fine new cabin, that greets you as you enter the main area, was near enough to completion for some to take an inside look-see. Also the Executive Board was able to use the wrap-around porch for their meeting. It's a quality addition to the Valley.
- Thanks to Johnny Cameron, the 1st Jones Valley International Inner Tube Olympics was a splashing success. With such events as the Inner Tube Relay, Tube Toss, Ball in Tube Toss, and Flop with Style, it was reported that Team Short People beat Team TT's, but there were lots of others also having a great time. - A surge in camping trailers for Reunion lodging was noted in 2008. In addition to the fold-up (popup) type brought by Johnny and Judy Cameron, as well as Gil and Jennifer Jones, last year both Milton Cameron and the Shane Nichols family set up nice travel trailers in the camping area and hung out in style. Shane and Jewel, who live in Atlanta, picked up their travel trailer in Little Rock, saving a lot of Interstate pulling time. Maybe Hot Springs this year?
- In addition to Johnny getting the Inner Tube event kicked off, Jeff Cameron set up and got the volleyball games going. And I believe that board games provided some nighttime entertainment, not to mention the music, of course, which we always enjoy. Unfortunately the horseshoes did not get a-flyin' – a definite opportunity here for a "community organizer."
- 2008 Family Business Meeting: Family members were recognized for their on-going contributions, especially Larry Braswell's year-round efforts to keep improving the Valley and the Reunion. Several ideas for fundraising were offered, a suggestion that washer/dryer facilities be made available was offered, and plans to renovate the Cubage Cabin were discussed. The status of Uncle Isaac's (Jim Williams') abandoned cabin was reviewed and the intention was to award Beth Augustine and her immediate family rights to it, given significant improvement is made within two years, was proposed. There were no objections; family members were only pleased with Beth's initiative and interest.
- 2008 Executive Board Meeting: Michael Gregory, Arkansas Forestry Commission, presented in detail a Forest Management Plan. Kelly Jobe, who has been managing this project for the Family, will be using this plan to develop the options for this year's Board Meeting to consider. Shane Nichols is continuing to guide the process that should result in the Family's incorporation, and other related matters in order to meet current legal standards. The Board approved President Larry Braswell's recommendation that Jim Williams (Uncle Isaac's) cabin be transferred to Beth Augustine and her immediate family with the condition that significant improvements be made within a reasonable period of time. Gil Jones' and Kelly Jobe's requests to





have certain sites dedicated for the development of camping or cabins were approved by the Board. Gil is currently camping in the location behind the Diffie cabin, and Kelly in the area where her parent's old trailer was located, in front of the Diffie cabin (the Diffies are very popular).

- In years past we have thanked, in the newsletter, all those making donations that provide the funds necessary to support the Reunion and our beautiful Jones Valley. If the donation was made at the time of the Reunion, we always try to thank all contributors at that time as well. After the 2008 Reunion, because this recognition is so important, almost all donors were sent a letter of gratitude. However, because one or two donations were in cash, and the donor was not identified at the time, those individuals did not receive a letter. Our sincere gratitude is now given for those donations; they are certainly equal to all the rest, and we will try not to let that one happen again.

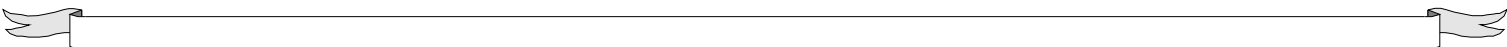
◆ Jones Valley This 'n' That ◆


Usage – I think it can be accurately stated that “the Valley is not just for Reunion time anymore.” This past year has been another where more Family members are enjoying Jones Valley in all of the four seasons. Exploring the woods, fishing, kayaking the Caddo, and just spending some quality cabin time – and hey! if you get tired of your own cooking, Ron's very good bar-b-q is just about a mile away. Also, I think I finally figured out why those going fishing do “catch and release” – the Fishnet in Glenwood does such a great job!

Camping Site – Cousin Gil Jones has continued to develop his site behind the Diffie Cabin for his camper. His latest improvements have been permanent electricity hookups and water access. Having this base camp definitely had something to do with Gil's and Larry Braswell's fall kayak fishing adventure on the Caddo River. (Take a look for yourself at: <http://jonesvalley.us/drupal/node/176>) In addition, Gil's (and ours too, of course) cousin, Amy Fortenberry, and her family dropped by in January and enjoyed a little Valley camping as well.

Special Contributions – Cathy and Gary Kornegay and family have long been active supporters of Jones Valley, helping in many areas, including Dining Hall and bathroom clean-up; however, some might be unaware of recent significant contributions. While they were having their cabin's septic system installed, they included a sanitary waste dump for campers. Gil enhanced this facility with a little cement work. Also, to help with Valley security, they funded a gate on the road leading up the Valley to limit access of non-Family members and they have helped tackle the cleanup of the really big tree that went down in the swimming hole last fall.

Storage and City Water – We have had a city water line installed on the property which also resulted in extra clearing around the main entrance gate to the cabin and dining hall area. Using timbers and tin from the Cubage Cabin restoration, a sturdy storage shed has been built near the rear of the large open field. This shed will be used to securely store





any Family equipment and other miscellaneous items. Up to now there has been nowhere to store anything, including maintenance items, except in individual cabins.

◆ Thank You Volunteers ◆

Your Clingman-Jones Family Reunion and Jones Valley depend on volunteers and voluntary donations (not the kind squeezed out of you at the office and other places). The volunteer effort is led by our president Larry Braswell, who not only guides the administrative chores, but actively steps up to see that the Valley is mowed, swimming hole cleaned and ready to go, and maintenance issues are responded to in a timely manner, and where possible, doing these things himself. The Founder's Monument, which is such a valuable addition to our campground, is another of these accomplishments. He and Paula have also made many operational improvements such as locating and transporting a grill to the Dining Hall which we are making good use of.



Not the least, among our regular volunteers is Karen Atkinson, who manages the kitchen and meals, as well as enduring Executive Board Meetings as the Arthur line representative. And thanks need to go out to all of those that just help pick up a piece of trash every now and then that somehow didn't make it by itself to the waste can. If you are thinking "How can I help out and enjoy the Valley more?" why not plan to come on down to Jones Valley on Memorial Day weekend and get with Larry for a few hours? It will be fun and help a lot.

Congratulations to all – yes cousins, there is good news out there.

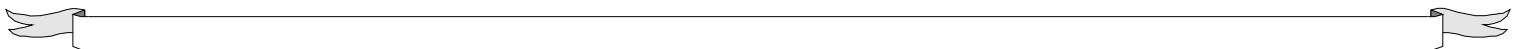
◆ Reunion 2009 Fun ‘n’ Games ◆

◆ Side Trips ◆

If you need a little excursion other than floating on the Caddo, there are many things close by to take in, from the tradition of Buttermilk Springs to the “tourista” heaven of Hot Springs. From visiting the town square up at Mt. Ida, to trying on the Possum Queen Throne, checking out Little Missouri Falls, looking over the crystal shops or even digging for diamonds, there's never a dull moment! Plus, there's some fine golfing over in Glenwood.

◆ Fireworks ◆

Locations for fireworks are ONLY: in the field behind the Cubage House, above Uncle Claude's Cabins, and up near the Hillbilly Cabin (Bowmans are known to be hard of hearing anyway). Last year Paul and Jane Bowman suffered both the loss of their son, Paul David Bowman, Jr. from a criminal act, and an automobile accident claimed the life of their granddaughter, Melody Jackson. All the Clingman-Jones family was shocked and deeply saddened by these events, where two vibrant, wonderful peoples' lives were cut tragically short, with so much of life yet to experience, share, and enjoy.

Last November, Nettie Sue White DaPra, Paul White's widow, passed away. For 64 years after Paul's early passing, Nettie Sue remained committed to the spirit of the Reunion and our ancestors' vision for Jones Valley. She faithfully attended every Reunion except one for the last 22 years and provided much support. Nettie Sue said she knew every one of the founders and that they were all exceptional people, and she had many delightful memories of the Valley.

The Biblical statement that “it is better to give than receive” certainly stands up in our case, for by giving we do receive.
